WHAT SORT OF HELP DID YOU GET FROM YOUR SPONSOR?

I also learned ways on helping to improve my stitch alignment and creating my own patterns by laying a graph not only on the pattern graph but also on the ground fabric to prevent miscounting which can cause unalignment.

WHERE WILL YOU GO FROM HERE?

While I will continue to recreate that which Mary and Elizabeth originally finished, I will also be moving onto my next adventure of table carpets.
